## Introduction - Review of Literature

- Key step in research process.
- It is an account of what is already known about a particular phenomenon.
- The main purpose of ROL is to convey to the readers about the work already done and the knowledge and ideas that have been already established on a particular topic of research.

## Review of Literature Definition

- Literature review is a body of text that aims to review the critical points of knowledge on a particular topic of research (ANA,2000)
- A literature review is an account of what has been already established or published on a particular research by accredited scholars and researchers (University Of Toronto, 2001)

## **Review of Literature**

- A literature review is an objective ,thorough summary and critical analysis of the relevant available research and non research literature on the topic being studied
   (Hart,1998)
- Review of literature is a systematic and critical review of the most important scholarly literature on a particular topic.
  -scholarly literature can refer to published and unpublished data based literature as well as conceptual(theoretical literature)

## **Review of Literature**

- Data based literature-comprise reports of research studies
  - eg. published quantitative and qualitative studies, unpublished masters and doctoral dissertations
- Conceptual(theoretical literature)-reports of theories
   eg. published documents ,chapters in books, conceptual
   frameworks/models, literature reviews of a concept

## Importance of review of literature

- Identification of a research problem and development or refinement of research questions
- Generation of useful research questions or projects for the discipline
- Orientation of what is known or not known about an idea of enquiry
- Determination of any gaps or inconsistencies in a body of knowledge

## Importance of review of literature

- Discovery of unanswered questions about subjects ,concepts or problems
- Determination of a need to replicate the study
- Identification of relevant theoretical or conceptual framework for research problems
- Identification or development of new or refined clinical interventions
- Description of the strength and weakness of designs /methods of enquiry and instruments used

## Importance of review of literature

- Development of hypothesis tested
- Helps in planning the methodology of present research study
- Helps in development of research instruments
- Identification of suitable design and data collection methods for a research study
- Assistance in interpreting study findings and in developing implications and recommendations

• Overall purpose-to develop a strong knowledge base for the conduct of research and other scholarly educational and clinical practice activities

#### <u>Research purposes of literature review:</u>

- 1.Determines what is known about a subject, concept or problem
- 2. Determines gaps, consistencies & inconsistencies about a subject,
  - concept or problem
- 3.Discovers unanswered questions about a subject, concept or problem

- 4. Discovers conceptual traditions used to examine problems
- Uncovers a new practice intervention, or gains support for changing a practice intervention
- 6. Promotes development of protocols & policies related to nursing practice
- Generates useful research questions or projects/activities for the discipline

8.Determines an appropriate research design/method

(instruments, data collection and analysis methods) for answering the research question

9.Determine the need for replication of a well designed study or refinement of a study

10.Describes strengths & weaknesses of designs, methods of inquiry and instruments used in earlier works

### Non research purposes

- 1. As an assignment for an academic course
- To update current personal knowledge and practice on a topic
- 3. To evaluate current practices
- 4. To develop and update guidelines for practice
- 5. To develop work related policies



## Purpose of literature review in Quantitative research

Identifying a problem

Gaining an understanding about the importance of study area, major concepts of interest.

• Establishing significance of the study

Determine whether it is truly valuable for nursing

research/rationale for the study

## Purpose of literature review in Quantitative research

• **Problem statement and hypotheses** 

The literature review helps to determine what is known and not known; to uncover gaps, consistencies, or inconsistencies, and/or to reveal unanswered questions about a subject, concept or problem

• Theoretical framework

The literature defines concepts and terms in relation to the study

## Purpose of literature review in Quantitative research

• Design and method

The literature review reveals strengths and weaknesses of designs and methods of previous research studies

• Outcome of the analysis (findings, implications, and recommendations)

The literature review is used to discuss the results or findings of a study. The discussion relates the study's findings to what was or was not found in the review of literature

## Purpose of literature review in Qualitative research

Purpose vary according to type of study

- Phenomenological research-compare and combine findings from study with the literature to determine current knowledge of a phenomenon
- Grounded theory research-explain ,support and extend the theory generated in the study
- Ethnographic research-provide a background for conducting the study, as in quantitative research
- Historical research- develop research question and provide a source of data in the study

#### **Traditional or Narrative review**

•Selective review of the literature that broadly covers a specific topic.

•Does not follow strict systematic methods to locate and synthesize articles.

•This type of review is useful in gathering together a volume of literature in a specific subject area and summarizing and synthesizing it.

 Primary purpose is to provide the reader with a comprehensive background for understanding current knowledge and highlighting significance of new research.

•It helps to identify gaps or inconsistencies in a body of knowledge

,helping researcher to determine or define research

question/hypotheses

•It is useful for topic selection and topic refinement

Systematic review

- It uses a more rigorous and well defined approach to
  - reviewing the literature in a specific subject area
- It uses explicit and rigorous criteria to identify , critically

evaluate and synthesize all literature on a particular topic

• Meta analysis-process of taking large body of quantitative findings

and conducting statistical analysis in order to integrate those

findings and enhance understanding

• Meta synthesis-non statistical technique used to integrate

evaluate and interpret findings of multiple qualitative research

studies.
